Reception



Reception have enjoyed the wintery start to 2024. We have loved wrapping up warm and exploring the frost and ice in our outdoor learning. Making transient art snowflakes, as we haven't had many real ones...yet!



We delighted in exploring our key text 'There is no dragon in this story' and revisiting all of our favourite traditional tales. This has lined up beautifully with the launch of the school wide fairytale project. We look forward to seeing what the children come up with and bring in to share for National tell a fairytale day in February.

Year 1

It's been a really busy start to 2024 in year 1! We have loved exploring our new text "Here We Are" by Oliver Jeffers and are getting ready to video record and then write our guides to living on planet earth. Our outdoor inspired art topic has been really hands on with plenty of colour mixing. We have loved getting our fingers stuck in with the paints! In geography we have been learning the names of the four countries of the United Kingdom. Why not challenge us and see if we can name them? Our computing topic is making using of "Bee Bots". We have explored using the controls to move them around and have been learning how to enter commands so that they can complete simple journeys. We have found this really exciting!



Year 2

Year 2 have made a fantastic start to 2024. We are all enjoying our new texts 'Revolting rhymes' and 'The Wolf's story'. We loved working together to perform 'Little Red Riding Hood'. In art we have been getting creative and we have been painting pictures in the style of Claude Monet.

For Geography the children recently visited Liverpool. The children loved looking at the waterfront and we discussed the difference between an urban and rural landscape. We have had a great time using algorithms

to get our 'Bee Bots' to move across the map. We have learnt the importance of giving instructions in the correct order.



Year 3

Year 3 have had a wonderful start to 2024. We have particularly enjoyed this half terms Geography topic exploring 'Spain' and how it is similar and different to the UK. The children have loved getting the atlases out and using their mapping skills to locate the countries. We have looked into the longitude and latitude exploring our coordinate skills and knowledge. We look forward to continuing our geography journey and seeing what else we discover about Spain.



Year 4

Year 4 have had a busy start to 2024 and have thrown ourselves into our learning. In science, we are exploring sound. The children have enjoyed experimenting with various instruments to help them understand how sound is made, how to alter pitch and how sound travels. We have been putting in lots of extra effort to secure our times table facts. We've been playing games both online and using practical equipment in order to speed up our recall. If you spot us around, feel free to ask us a multiplication question.

As part of our RE work on The Church Community, Father Martin visited us in school to tell us all about his role in the parish and about the many other people who contribute to our local parishes. Thank you Father Martin for helping to deepen our understanding.



Year 5

What a wonderful start to the New Year we have had in Year 5. The children have blown us away with their understanding and enjoyment of 'The Highwayman' by Alfred Noyes and embraced the grammatical features of the poem.

In art we have been exploring the designs of William Morris before designing our own, making our own printing blocks and considering repeating patterns.

Our indoor PE this half term has seen us create motifs related to WWII and include movement into our sequences.

We also welcomed Nick and Lucas, local PCSO's who asked us to help raise awareness of speed limits on our roads.

A busy half term! Well done Year 5.



Year 6

Y6 have had an amazing start to 2024! The children will be taking part in the 'Faith in Action' project. During the rest of this school year the children will collect merits and will be able to continue this journey into Secondary School. They will reflect and practice sharing our gospel values of respect, kindness, love and care.

Y6 this term have been enjoying working with Military School. The sessions help children with their resilience, confidence and teamwork. It also works on them developing their leadership and personal skills and will inspire and motivate the children for the future.

In Science, the children have been enjoying making different electrical circuits and finding out what happens to the brightness of the bulbs when we add more voltage or bulbs to the circuit.

In Geography, we have been looking at trade and differences between importing and exporting goods. The children have learnt the different parts of the supply chain and have researched the top ten exports of the UK.

Sporting News

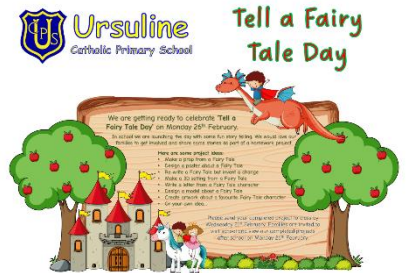

Healthy Lunchboxes

We encourage all our parents/carers who provide a packed lunch for their child to provide a balanced meal. Government guidelines recommend that a packed lunch should include:

- One portion of fruit or vegetables each day.
- Meat, fish or another source of non-dairy protein each day (e.g. lentils, beans, pulses, falafel).
- A starchy food each day e.g. rice, potatoes, pasta, noodles, couscous, cereals.
- A dairy food each day e.g. milk, cheese, yoghurt, fromage frais.
- An oily fish at least once every three weeks.

Healthy Snacks
