Reception

Year 1

Year 1 enjoyed a fabulous experience at Kingsley and Co's amazing bookshop. Alongside solving some tricky puzzles they also enjoyed choosing their own book to keep and a hot chocolate treat. The highlight of the visit was meeting two elves and helping them to complete Santa's list before all receiving their own gift. Our design and technology topic was inspired by moving pictures, including sliders and levers. We began by learning how these parts work and then designed



and produced our own finished moving pictures. In history we have really enjoyed exploring leisure from the past. The children had a wonderful time interviewing Mrs Moody about her childhood and then exploring a range of different toys from different time periods before sorting them. We then used different sources of evidence, including picture postcards to explore how holidays have changed over time. Year 1 worked together with their friends from year 2 to produce a fantastic performance of 'Twinkly Nativity'. After two fabulous performances we were then asked to visit Mencap to spread some Christmas cheer.

Year 2

Healthy Lunchboxes

We encourage all our parents/carers who provide a packed lunch for their child to provide a balanced meal. Government guidelines recommend that a packed lunch should include:

- One portion of fruit or vegetables each day.
- Meat, fish or another source of non-dairy protein each day (e.g. lentils, beans, pulses, falafel).
- A starchy food each day e.g. rice, potatoes, pasta, noodles, couscous, cereals.
- A dairy food each day e.g. milk, cheese, yoghurt, fromage frais.
- An oily fish at least once every three weeks.
